The course is divided into 11 sections:

Introduction, aims and outcomes

This section introduces the subject and gives the aims and outcomes of the course.

Overview of environmental management

Here we give an overview of the theory underpinning EMSs and outline their advantages and disadvantages. Details of the major EMS standards used in the UK are given in this section.

EMS requirements for BS EN ISO 14001:2015

This section describes the requirements needed to develop, implement and maintain an EMS certifiable to the EMS standard ISO 14001.

Context of the organisation

In this section we explain the need for an organisation to determine its context, and in doing so, identify the risks and opportunities that can affect its environmental performance.

Leadership

This section explains the responsibilities on Top Management to demonstrate leadership and commitment for the EMS, including the development of an environmental policy.

Planning

Here we describe how the standard requires an organisation to understand and fulfil its compliance obligations and identify & evaluate environmental aspects.

Support

This section explains the requirement to ensure that relevant people are competent to conduct their roles that affect an organisation's environmental performance, and provide training where necessary.

Operation

This section describes the requirement for an organisation to develop operational control processes to manage its risks and opportunities, and plan to respond to emergency situations.

Performance evaluation

This section explains the requirement for an organisation to monitor, check and improve the performance of the EMS.

Improvement

Here we explain the requirement for an organisation to develop processes for identifying and reacting to non-conformances.
